Updates on the QDR and the project group on learning opportunities in Europass

State of Play: Qualifications

- **18** countries **published** data on qualifications (BE (fr+nl), CZ, DE, EE, EL, IE, LT, LV, MT, NL, HU, PL, PT, SI, SE, IS, TR)
- **2** countries are in the **testing phase** in QDR (AT, HR)



State of Play: Learning Opportunities

- 8 countries **published** data on learning opportunities (France, Greece, Malta, Portugal, Iceland, Ireland, Serbia and Norway)
- 5 countries are in the **testing phase** in QDR (Belgium(nl), Croatia, Sweden, Slovenia and Germany)



Sharing qualifications and learning opportunities data in Europass – delegation option

- National authorities can name another trusted/accredited organisations to submit data to Europass via the QDR tool
- Objective: **pilot** with a few countries **the delegation option**
- Advantages
 - *Timing:* to speed up the provision of data, there is no need to collect all the data centrally first;
 - *Data Coverage:* to fill any gaps in the data that might be available centrally. E.g. if the data is not collected centrally for VET; the National Authority can delegate to VET providers directly. This can enrich the available data.
